

Gothic and Gothick

This style of architecture and decoration spans the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, whilst also reaching back to the buildings and culture of medieval England. This list does not extend to Gothic literature, but the novels of Walpole, Mrs Radcliffe and others fit within this genre.
