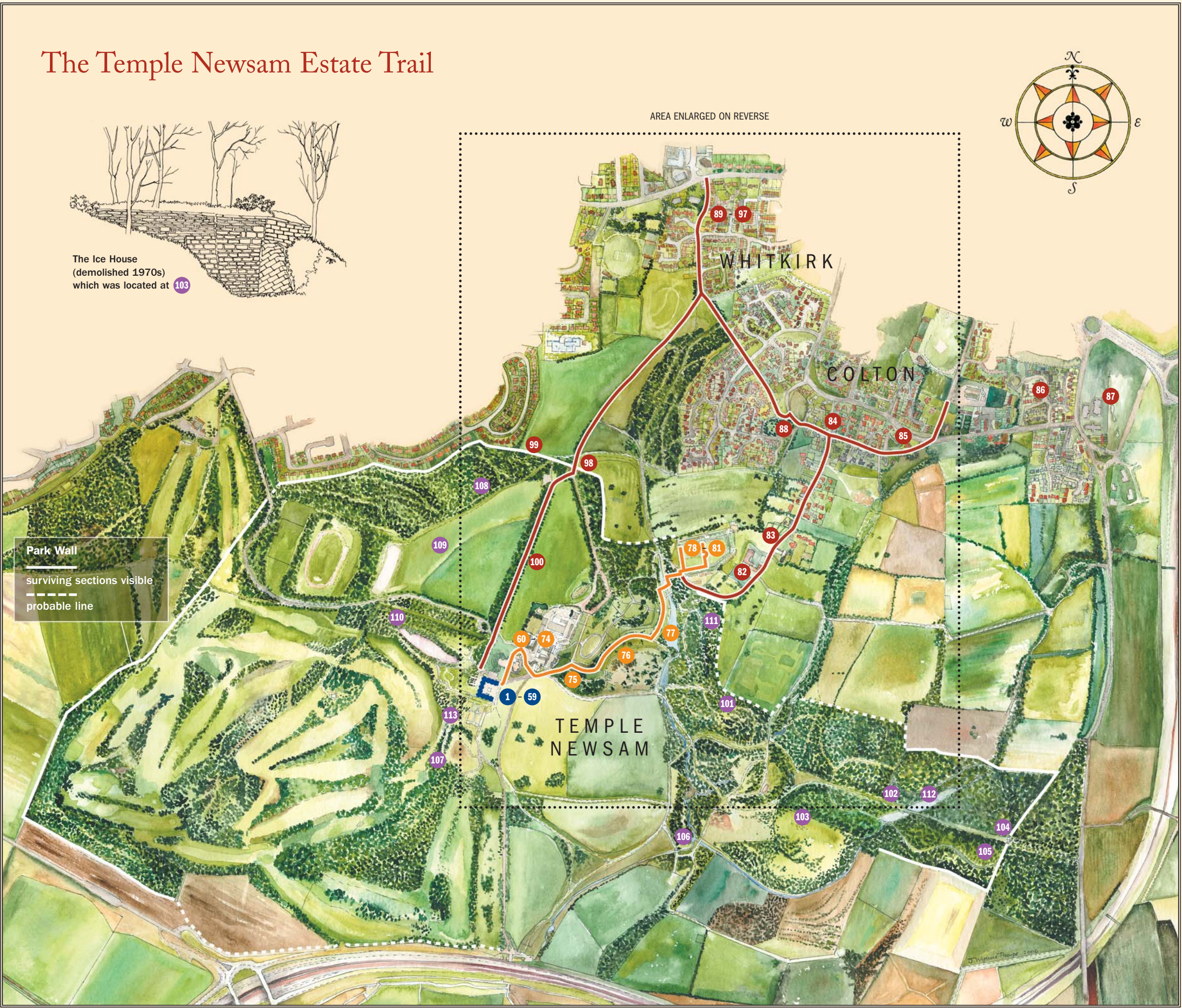

# The Temple Newsam Estate Trail

For 500 years Temple Newsam has been home to a thriving community. The great house and its estate of over 4,000 acres has provided work and homes for countless servants, gardeners, foresters, miners and other employees of all kinds. Likewise much of the wealth of the owners of the property was derived from the rents of the tenanted farms and coal mines, and in developing the full potential of the land. This project explores the inter-relationship between the house and its estate, looking at the lives of those who lived here, as well as the changing appearance of an historic landscape that has now almost entirely vanished.



## Using this guide

The exhibition takes the form of a self-led three-part trail which may be taken as a whole or in part, as time allows:

- House Tour (min. 1 hour)
- Stables, Farm and Gardens Tour (1 hour)
- Villages Tour (1-1½ hours)
